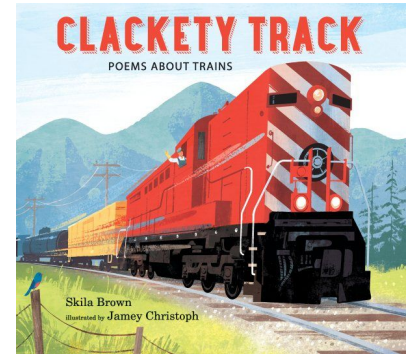


**Evanston Public Library

***Thinker: My Puppy Poet and Me* by Eloise Greenfield, ill. Ehsan Abdollahi**

Sumptuous portraits of great black heroes illustrate a poem celebrating the brave, worthy, audacious, and undefeated.
